# CHOOSE

**RECENTLY, I WAS** in a very long drive-through line at a coffee shop. The parking lot was tight and someone was trying to back out of a parking spot. For them to back out, there had to be a break in the line. So when the driver in front of me moved up, I waited so the person could pull out. Instantly, the driver behind me aggressively

honked their horn. When I looked in my rearview mirror, they were making inappropriate gestures at me.

In a situation like that, it can be tempting to get angry. However, I thought, "Maybe they're having a really bad day or received some really bad news." As I pulled up to the window to pay for my coffee, I decided to pay for their coffee as well. Instead of responding in anger—which is what I wanted to do—I did what Jesus would do. I chose love.

#### WHERE IS THE LOVE?

As I look across the landscape of the world today, it seriously concerns me how angry people are. The amount of anger, judgment, and arguing on social media alone is disturbing. It's especially sad when I see Spirit-filled people, pastors, and ministers engage in that type of behavior.

It seems that as God-loving people, we've lost some of our love walk. Over the past three years in particular, we have lost some of our kindness. I believe it is time for us to get back to studying, reading about, and walking in the love of God.

The Apostle John had a lot to say about walking in love.

#### 1 JOHN 4:7-8 (AMP)

**7** Beloved, let us [unselfishly] love and seek the best for one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves [others] is born of God and knows God [through personal experience].

8 The one who does not love has not become acquainted with God [does not and never did know Him], for God is love. [He is the originator of love, and it is an enduring attribute of His nature.]

You see, God doesn't just walk in love. He *is* love! It's in His DNA. He can't help but love. And as God's children, we have that same love in our DNA because His love has been abundantly

poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit (Rom. 5:5).

Someone may say, "I'm impatient. I can't help it. It's just who I am." If you have been born again, it is not just who you are. Once we are saved, God's nature becomes our nature. Therefore, we no longer have any excuse for not walking in love.

When we value people, we take care of them. We don't use them or treat them like trash.

#### **QUALITIES OF LOVE**

The Bible is full of scriptures that teach us how to continually walk in love. We find one example in Ephesians chapter 5.

#### EPHESIANS 5:1-2 (AMP)

**1** Therefore become imitators of God [copy Him and follow His example], as well-beloved children [imitate their father];

**2** and walk continually in love [that is, value one another – practice empathy and compassion, unselfishly seeking the best for others], just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us, an offering and sacrifice to God [slain for you, so that it became] a sweet fragrance.

One way we can walk in love is by valuing others. Most people take care of the things they value. When we value people, we take care of them. We don't use them or treat them like trash.

Love is full of empathy. *Empathy* is the ability to relate to someone else's pain. We may not agree with everyone, but we don't have to be disagreeable with them. Empathy seeks to understand and relate to what someone else is going through.

Love is full of compassion. Compassion is a feeling that arises when you're confronted with another person's suffering, and it motivates you to relieve it. Throughout the Gospels we see Jesus being moved with compassion and using His power to relieve the suffering. When we see someone who is unsaved or hurting, we should be moved with compassion because we have the answer to help them.

Love unselfishly seeks the best for others. This takes sacrifice on our part. Sacrifice is basically putting aside what we want for someone else's sake. Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice when He God doesn't just walk in love. He is love! It's in His DNA. He can't help but to love. And as God's children, that same love is a part of our DNA.

came to earth and died on the cross for us. He did it because He loved us. It wasn't what was best for Him, but it was best for us so we could live eternally with the Father in Heaven.

#### WE HAVE A CHOICE

Choosing love isn't always easy. Walking in love is in direct opposition to our selfish human nature. Each day we must decide whether we will choose love or revert to our old ways of doing only what is good for us.

It doesn't bother me when non-Christians are rude, nasty, and mean. They're simply doing what is natural for someone who doesn't know Jesus. But when I see Spirit-led Christians being angry, selfish, and judgmental, or lashing out on social media, I have a hard time with that. God's love lives in us. We should know better.

I'm convinced that this whole Christian thing we do every day and give our lives for is not about us and how much God can bless us. It's all about how much we can love others.

My challenge to you is simply to walk in love. Choose to value others, to practice empathy and compassion, and to sacrifice your desires for what's best for others. When we all do that, our families will look different. Our marriages and relationships will change. Our whole world will change. And we'll be able to minister to people and reach them by simply choosing love.

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#### FAITH IN ACTION

Galatians 5:22–23 (TPT) says, "But the fruit produced by the Holy Spirit within you is divine love in all its varied expressions: joy that overflows, peace that subdues, patience that endures, kindness in action, a life full of virtue, faith that prevails, gentleness of heart, and strength of spirit. Never set the law above these qualities, for they are meant to be limitless."

However others treat us and whatever they say about us, these qualities produced in our hearts by the Holy Spirit through God's love should be limitless in us.

#### 1 John 4:20-21 (NLT)

**20** If someone says, "I love God," but hates a fellow believer, that person is a liar; for if we don't love people we can see, how can we love God, whom we cannot see?

**21** And he has given us this command: Those who love God must also love their fellow believers.

Heavenly Father, thank You for the love You have poured abundantly into my heart by the Holy Spirit. Father, You are love. And because I am made in Your image, my DNA is love. Thank You for showing me through Jesus how to live in love.

Father, right now I choose love. I commit to genuinely love others. Forgive me for not being patient, kind, and loving. Forgive me for being judgmental, argumentative, and angry with people. Help me each day to choose compassion, selflessness, forgiveness, and kindness. When I am tempted to respond in an unloving way, remind me of the commitment I made today. In Jesus' Name, amen.

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**IN FIRST KINGS** 18:41 (NKJV) Elijah said to King Ahab, "Go up, eat and drink, for there is the sound of the abundance of rain." The word abundance indicates an overwhelming amount. As we continue reading this story, realize that something significant is about to happen.

#### 1 KINGS 18:42–45 (NKJV)

**42** So Ahab went up to eat and drink. And Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; then he bowed down on the ground, and put his face between his knees,

**43** and said to his servant, "Go up now, look toward the sea." So he went up and looked, and said, "There is nothing." And seven times he said, "Go again."

44 Then it came to pass the seventh time, that he said, "There is a cloud, as small as a man's hand, rising out of the sea!" So he said, "Go up, say to Ahab, 'Prepare your chariot, and go down before the rain stops you.' "
45 Now it happened in the meantime that the sky became black with clouds and wind, and there was a heavy rain....

In verse 41, it's interesting that when Elijah talked to King Ahab, there was no sign of rain. Notice that Elijah didn't say rain was coming. He said, "*There is the sound* . . . ," present tense.

Elijah perceived what God wanted for Israel and began declaring it to be so. Many Christians think doing that is enough. But verse 42 tells us Elijah went to Carmel, bowed down, put his face between his knees, and contended in prayer for what He knew God wanted.

So many times, we want to pray comfortably. Not Elijah. He pressed in. He lifted his voice to Heaven and called on God until it started to rain.

We often give up easily in prayer. We don't yield to the Spirit and go far enough. **IF WE WANT WHAT GOD HAS FOR US, WE MUST CONTEND FOR IT.** People often say, "Well, I prayed, and I'm believing God." That's good, but sometimes it's not enough.

#### THE END-TIME OUTPOURING

The rain in First Kings chapter 18 was a type of the outpouring of God's Spirit. And that incident wasn't the Spirit's peak performance. He is not getting old, growing weak, or fading away.

Scripture says the end of a thing is better than the beginning (Eccl. 7:8). God is not working to calm things down. He's stepping them up and wrapping them up for the Church.

Acts chapter 2 tells us **GOD WANTS TO POUR OUT HIS SPIRIT ON ALL FLESH.** The Holy Spirit is looking for people of faith. He is waiting to hear words of faith spoken so He can perform them. He's looking for yielded people who will contend for what they know is God's will. The outpouring of the Spirit is in the Church today, but most people aren't talking or acting like it. We are in the last days, the time of the Holy Spirit. We don't have to wait for the outpouring. It's here.

Since the Day of Pentecost, there have been continuous outpourings of God's Spirit. He's being poured out upon us afresh and anew day after day.

It's time to declare, "I *hear* the sound of the end-time outpouring." The Spirit moves in power and healing *today*. He guides and directs us *today*. The time for the Church to come forth is *today*!

God is calling us to a deeper level of praying and contending for His things. Now is the time to contend for what He's spoken to our hearts.

We can't give up when the devil throws a fit or quit when circumstances don't look good. And we can't wait until we see something to say it is happening. We must say by faith, "It is happening!"

I hear the sound of the abundance of rain. Let's lift our voices in faith and contend for God's purpose for this hour.  $\mathbf{\Psi}$

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**THE PROBLEMS OF** life are real. Tragedy is real. Sickness, disease, and the loss of jobs and income are real. No matter what our education, strengths, skills, or financial status, every one of us at one time or another will encounter problems that lie beyond our resources to solve.

We will—if we haven't already—come to realize that we have limitations. But along with that realization, we also need to realize that there is hope beyond ourselves, a ray of light beyond the dark tunnel of our human limits. And we need to know that we are not alone.

No doubt we've all reached times in life when we simply didn't

know what to do. The circumstances seemed impossible from our standpoint. During those times we can throw up our hands in despair and allow feelings of hopelessness to overwhelm us. Or we can look to the Limitless One and let Him strengthen and revive us so we see the possibilities that exist with Him.

#### GOD WANTS US TO DEPEND ON HIM

So what *do* you do if your marriage is in trouble? If your kids are rebelling against you and the things of God? If your doctor gives you a bad report? If you find out after putting in years at your place of employment that your job has been terminated?

I can't specifically tell you what to do in each situation of life. But I can point you to the One who can—and who *will*! Some problems arise through no fault of our own; others we bring on ourselves. But God wants to show us the way out of *all* of them!

Certainly, in the tests and trials of life, we need to make sure

we're not doing something that would prevent God from helping us. For example, if we're not walking in love, we can shortcircuit His power in our lives even though He's willing to help us. But once we do the things we know to do, we must trust this timeless truth: *What is impossible with man is possible with God.* We should let it permeate our hearts and dominate our thinking.

#### YOUR REVELATION IS YOUR FOUNDATION

That's what Jesus said in Luke 18:27: "The things which are impossible with men are possible with God." We have to receive a revelation of that truth. It can't be mere words that we only mentally agree with. This truth has to become an attitude of life. Then we will be in a strong, steady position to reap those Godpossibilities.

You see, until something becomes a revelation to you, you won't act on it. You may go along with it mentally when you hear it. But it won't be a living reality to you, and it won't produce anything of lasting value in your life.

You may be facing a situation where it sounds impossible that God's Word can become more real to you than whatever you are going through. But it *is* possible! When God's Word becomes revelation to you in your heart, it will be a rock that will not be shaken. Nothing can take the truth of the Word away from you if you hold on to it—not circumstances, not other people, and not the enemy himself! And the Word you hold on to will produce something powerful in your life.

#### MAN IS LIMITED

Someone may read the first part of Luke 18:27 and ask, "Well, isn't that a negative statement?" No, it is simply a testament to man's limitations. Humans are limited. We are often limited by



knowledge or intellect. We are limited by our natural strength-our physical bodies.

We need to understand who we are as human beings to appreciate what God can do through us and for us. In ourselves, we are nothing, and apart from God, we can do nothing. But we also must understand that as believers,

their Creator. He doesn't make mistakes-and He doesn't make inferior creations!

Jesus Himself said, "I do not pray that You [God the Father] should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world" (John 17:15-16 NKJV).

We are in the world, but we are not of the world!

As I said, believers have the unique ability to live in two realms at the same time. When we are born again, we gain citizenship

we have the unique ability to live in two realms. We live in and have access to the *limited earthly* realm and the limitless heavenly realm.

To recognize our limitations, we must understand our individual strengths and weaknesses. Too many people are trying to be something they're not supposed to be-simply because they want to!

Throughout the Bible, we see great leaders whom God used to

bring deliverance, blessing, and protection to His people. We should all try to emulate their faith, but that doesn't mean we should try to emulate their office.

If your talent lies in one area, and you're trying to function in other areas, you will be frustrated! Certainly, you can feel challenged when you're functioning in the

middle of God's perfect will. But He gives you grace. You may feel challenged at times, but you won't continually be frustrated.

#### KNOW THYSELF

One of the great secrets of success is to find out your abilities and limitations and go from there. In other words, know thyself! God created those abilities within you, and He wants to use them to His glory. On the other hand, unless you have specifically heard from God to do otherwise, don't go beyond your limitations.

When you find out who you really are, and you begin to operate in those channels, things will go well for you. That's

The doctors informed Ken and me that the tumor, the size of a large lemon, was pressing against his brain stem. One blow to the head could have ended his life.

At that moment, nothing

on this earth mattered to us but the life of our son. We prayed with all of our hearts and stood firmly on God's Word as we believed for Craig's healing. Our families and friends prayed with us, but there was no immediate change in his condition. Then my father-in-law said something very powerful to us. He said, "An army never goes to battle without a second line of defense."

Since we were dealing with a life-and-death situation and Craig's healing hadn't instantly manifested, we believed God was leading us to adopt "a second line of defense." We decided to let the doctors perform surgery to remove the tumor.

We began to focus our faith and prayers on the operation. We prayed for God to guide the surgeon's hands, and we also believed for the tumor to be benign and not malignant. Above all, we prayed that the doctors would be able to remove the tumor without any damage or negative side effects.

As we prepared for the surgery, I was at home packing so I could stay with Craig while he was in the hospital. As I stood there in the middle of my closet, I began to cry out to the Lord, "God, I need to feel You right now! I know we walk by faith, but I need to feel Your presence. I need to hear Your voice. I need You to speak to me!"

I needed to feel the comfort of the Holy Spirit reassuring me that everything was going to be OK. I knew it in my heart, but I needed to feel God's presence at that moment because I felt so alone.

I had barely gotten those words out of my mouth when something dropped from the closet shelf and landed on the floor in front of me. I picked it up and discovered it was a small lapel pin that someone had given us a few months earlier. It had a little saying written on it-"You can make it!" God was saying, "Lynette, you can make it!"

I sighed with relief and thanked God. I then rushed to Craig's bedroom and told him, "Son, look! The Lord has just dropped a pin from Heaven. We're going to pin this on you, and if fear tries to grip you when you go into the operating room, just remember what the pin says."

It was amazing how God confirmed what He had spoken to us through that little pin. No matter how long we sat in the waiting room, I had confidence in the Lord that Craig was going to make it.

The surgery went perfectly. In fact, the power of God was so strong in the operating room that one of the nurses, a ministry partner of ours, was completely healed of a chronic back condition!

It's been 40 years since that surgery, and Craig has had no negative effects from the tumor or operation.

## DON'T BE SHOCKED WHEN THE FIRE GETS HOT

The Apostle Peter said something about the fiery trials of life that really grabbed my attention. He said, "Dear friends, don't be surprised at the fiery trials you are going through, as if something strange were happening to you" (1 Peter 4:12 NLT).

God wants us to know that we'll all be tested by fire. But He also said, "When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, nor shall the flame scorch you" (Isa. 43:2 NKJV). We can stand on that promise when we're going through the fiery trials of life.

## WHEN WE PASS THROUGH A FIERY TRIAL, **IT'S SO IMPORTANT THAT** WE HAVE FAITH.

When we pass through a fiery trial, it's so important that we have faith. But we also must be committed to the Lord as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were. (See Daniel chapter 3.)

Before being cast into the fiery furnace, they declared, "Our God whom we serve is able to deliver us . . . and He will deliver us" (Dan. 3:17 NKJV). That was their faith talking. But they added a statement of their commitment to the Lord. They said, "But even if God doesn't deliver us, we will not serve your gods or worship the golden image you have set up" (v. 18).

The three Hebrew children had to go through the fire, but Jesus met them in the middle of it. When they came out, there were no signs they had ever been in the fire.

I don't know what crisis has come your way or what fiery trial you may be experiencing. But I know that the same God who met me in the middle of my fiery trial will meet you in the middle of yours. And He will cause you to triumph over it, just as He promised in His Word..

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**OFTENTIMES PEOPLE** who do not speak in tongues ask, "Why do folks give such importance to speaking with other tongues?" There are at least three reasons:

1. Speaking with other tongues is always manifested when one is baptized in the Holy Spirit. It is the supernatural evidence of His infilling in a person's life.

2. The spiritual gifts of tongues and interpretation of tongues are distinctive of today's dispensation (1 Cor. 12:1–11).

3. The Apostle Paul gave prominence to the subject of tongues. In his first letter to the Corinthian church, he wrote much about it. (See First Corinthians chapter 14.) Why? Because then, as now, the subject was misunderstood.

Here are some common objections people have to speaking in tongues.

#### **#1: 'JESUS DIDN'T SPEAK IN TONGUES.'**

Although the other seven gifts of the Spirit manifested in Jesus' earthly ministry, you won't find tongues and interpretation. Jesus said God would give this new gift under the New Covenant. Mark's Gospel records five supernatural signs that are to follow believers.

#### MARK 16:17-18

**17** And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues;

**18** They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.

One supernatural sign is speaking in tongues. Some try to explain verse 17 away by saying people won't tell vulgar jokes or lie anymore. While you shouldn't do either, this scripture is not talking about that.

If four of the five signs are supernatural, it doesn't make sense that one would be natural. And Jesus didn't say a few believers would speak in tongues. He clearly said all believers should do so.

Why don't some believers pray in tongues? Sometimes people

have personal reasons, but I'm sure the main reason is little teaching on its importance has been done. Christians don't realize the value of speaking in tongues. If they did, they would want to do it.

#### **#2: 'TONGUES ARE OF THE DEVIL.'**

Some Christians are concerned they will receive a wrong spirit when they pray for the baptism in the Holy Spirit. But if you ask God to fill you with His Spirit, He will not give you something else.

#### LUKE 11:11-13

**11** If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone? or if he ask a fish, will he for a fish give him a serpent?

12 Or if he shall ask an egg, will he offer him a scorpion?13 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?

Luke 10:19 says, "Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you." Jesus wasn't talking about literal snakes or scorpions here. He was talking about the power of Satan and demons.

This lets us know that Jesus was referring to an evil spirit in Luke chapter 11. He said, "If a son asks for a fish, will his father give him a serpent (an evil spirit)? Or, if he asks for an egg, will his father offer him a scorpion (an evil spirit)?" We never have to be afraid to receive the Holy Spirit.

#### **#3: 'TONGUES HAVE CEASED.'**

People use First Corinthians 13:8 to say that tongues have ceased.

#### **1 CORINTHIANS 13:8**

8 Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there be knowledge, it shall vanish away.

This verse says tongues *shall* cease, not that they *have* ceased. It also says prophecies *shall* fail and knowledge *shall* vanish away.



"Shall" is future tense. Tongues haven't ceased any more than knowledge has vanished away.

First Corinthians 14:39 goes on to say, "Wherefore, brethren, covet to prophesy, and forbid not to speak with tongues." The Apostle Paul never forbade people to speak in tongues; he encouraged them to speak.

#### #4: 'ONLY THE APOSTLES COULD PRAY FOR PEOPLE TO RECEIVE THE BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT.'

People who hold to the argument that tongues ceased with the last apostle say the apostles received the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost and were able to pass the Spirit on to others. But those folks couldn't pass Him on to anyone else.

They use Acts 8:14–17 to support their case by saying that Philip was able to get the Samaritans born again but not filled with the Spirit. Peter and John went to Samaria to get them filled. But that argument isn't in line with scripture.

#### ACTS 9:10-12, 17

**10** And there was a certain disciple at Damascus, named Ananias; and to him said the Lord in a vision, Ananias. And he said, Behold, I am here, Lord.

**11** And the Lord said unto him, Arise, and go into the street which is called Straight, and enquire in the house of Judas for one called Saul, of Tarsus: for, behold, he prayeth,

**12** And hath seen in a vision a man named Ananias coming in, and putting his hand on him, that he might receive his sight. . . .

**17** And Ananias went his way, and entered into the house; and putting his hands on him said, Brother Saul, the Lord, even Jesus, that appeared unto thee in the way as thou camest, hath sent me, that thou mightest receive thy sight, and **be filled with the Holy Ghost.** 

Ananias was not an apostle, prophet, evangelist, pastor, or teacher. He was a layperson. The Lord Jesus, the Head of the Church, directed him to lay hands on Saul to receive the Holy Spirit.

## Begin Speaking in Tongues

Are you born again but not Spirit-filled? If so, pray this prayer to be baptized in the Holy Spirit:

#### Heavenly Father, I ask You to baptize me in the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in other tongues. In Jesus' Name, amen.

Now begin to speak in tongues. Yield to the Spirit and let Him give you the utterance to speak in a language unknown to you.

I believe God put this account in the Bible because He knew we'd face this argument. You don't have to be one of the early apostles to lead someone into the baptism in the Holy Spirit. You don't even have to be a minister. Today, believers around the world are helping people get filled with the Holy Spirit just as Ananias did long ago.

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HAVE YOU EVER felt drawn to a fountain? What about it caught your attention? Was it the way the water jetted into the air? Or the soothing sound as it sprayed and splashed?

Centuries ago, fountains provided water for townspeople and villagers to drink, bathe, and wash. Today we have different kinds of fountains. Some are decorative. Others can supply cool drinking water.

In ancient times many stories were written about fountains. Usually those water sources represented life. The truth is, we cannot live without water. And those fountains symbolize something we absolutely have to have.

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The Bible says, "God is the fountain of life" (Psalm 36:9). He is its Source. We cannot really live without Him. Just as ancient villagers built their homes around their water source, we must build our lives around Him.

Jesus said, "Are you weary, carrying a heavy burden? Come to me. I will refresh your life, for I am your oasis. Simply join your life with mine. Learn my ways and you'll discover that I'm gentle, humble, easy to please. You will find refreshment and rest in me. For all that I require of you will be pleasant and easy to bear" (Matthew 11:28–30 TPT).

Are you tired? Has your load in life been getting heavier and heavier? Do you just feel drained and wish you could find some peace and rest? God wants to help you. Let Him be your oasis—your fountain of life.

To join your life with His, ask Jesus, His Son, into your heart. Make Him Lord of your life. You do that by praying this prayer:

#### God,

I come to You in Jesus' Name. The Bible says, "If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9 NKJV). I believe in my heart that Jesus is Your Son and that You raised Him from the dead. And I confess Jesus as my Lord. Therefore, I am saved! Thank You! Please refresh me and teach me Your ways.

## **GOD'S GIFT OF PEACE**

**I BELIEVE WE** would all agree that we are living in chaotic days. When we read God's Word, it would seem we are in the days that Paul described to Timothy.

Second Timothy 3:1–4 (NLT) says, "You should know this, Timothy, that in the last days there will be very difficult times. For people will love only themselves and their money. They will be boastful and proud, scoffing at God, disobedient to their parents, and ungrateful. They will consider nothing sacred. They will be unloving and unforgiving; they will slander others and have no self-control. They will be cruel and hate what is good. They will betray their friends, be reckless, be puffed up with pride, and love pleasure rather than God."

In navigating through this season, it is easy to stay in a state of turmoil, frustration, and fear. When you watch the news or get on social media, you witness people bickering and being intolerant of others. Adverse weather conditions are reported somewhere in the world on a daily basis. And, of course, the rising cost of everything causes us to adjust and reevaluate our budgets.

We do not realize that all the information we acquire daily can keep our minds in a state of unrest, even if the news does not directly affect us. Our thoughts can cause us to become depressed. God does not want us to live in that state of mind. One of the things I cherish is living a peaceful life. It is difficult to navigate life or make proper decisions when we are not experiencing peace.

A scripture I refer to often is Isaiah 26:3, "Thou will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee." The New Living Translation says it this way, "You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you!"

We do not have a lot of trouble with our thoughts when everything is going well. But when things around us are being shaken on a daily basis, the enemy tries to invade our thought life. The Holy Spirit is a gentleman and gently whispers to us. Satan hollers in our ears and enhances our thoughts.

In these days, it is important to keep our minds focused on God. He is the one Who will keep us in perfect peace. What is perfect peace? It is a condition of freedom from disturbance within the soul. You may wonder how we can keep our minds constantly on God.

I have shared this in previous columns, but it bears repeating. Being raised in a pastor's home, we faced many circumstances that could rob us of peace. I found, even as a teenager, that worship music kept my mind focused on the Lord and not on the situation at hand.

Years ago, before cassette tapes, 8-tracks, CDs, and MP3s were vinyl records. I had a record player with a stack of records that would play the entire day. And I played them 24 hours a day! I wanted Craig and Denise to constantly be filled with faith-building songs.

Many children came over to our house to play with Craig and Denise. Because of the peaceful music, they did not fuss or fight with each other. In fact, my neighbor once asked me what kind of music I played at my house. She said, "My son comes home so peaceful

and singing unfamiliar songs."

I still surround myself with worship music. It plays in our house constantly, even when we are not at home. When I am in a hotel, my music is playing in our room constantly.

With modern technology, I have playlists. I listen to some songs while I'm sleeping and others when I'm awake. I have playlists for various situations that I'm dealing with. If I am tempted to worry about something, I listen to "Not Gonna Worry" by the Gaither Vocal Band. Part of the lyrics go, "I'm not gonna worry, I'm not gonna fret. He's got the whole thing in His hands." I encourage you to surround yourself with worship music that ministers to you.

God is always there to minister peace in every situation. When Jesus was leaving this earth, He gave the disciples a word that is still good for us today. John 14:27 (NLT) "I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don't be troubled or afraid." I encourage you to accept God's gift of peace.
