What Can You Believe?

With God, nothing is impossible. If you can believe that,
THE IMPOSSIBLE CAN HAPPEN IN YOUR LIFE.

GOD IS STILL in the healing business, saving business, and baptizing in the Holy Spirit business. Nothing is too hard for Him. Nothing is impossible with Him. We think things are impossible, but with God, nothing is impossible. If you can believe that, the impossible can happen in your life.

That's what Jesus said to the man who brought his son for healing. The boy suffered from convulsions, often falling into water or fire. His father had his mind on what Jesus could *do*. He said, "*If thou canst do any thing, have compassion on us, and help us*" (Mark 9:22).

That's where many people miss it. They focus on "What can you do to help me?" But that's not the main problem. The main problem is, "What can you believe?"

Jesus answered the man, "*If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth*" (Mark 9:23). All things are possible! To whom are they possible? To the person who believes.

Too often we look at situations and say, "That's impossible." But nothing is truly impossible. It doesn't matter what it is or how hopeless it looks. To believe that, you must renew your mind with God's Word. But if you let your flesh dominate you, you'll keep thinking that things are impossible. We need to retrain our thinking. All things are possible to him that believes.

GOD NEVER CHANGES

This worked in Old Testament days too. We can learn a great deal studying how God helped men and women back then. God never changes. Human nature hasn't changed either. Sin is still

sin. Sickness and disease are still the same. And faith in God still brings results.

Let's examine the case of King Hezekiah, an Old Testament figure who believed that all things are possible with God.

ISAIAH 38:1-3

1 In those days was Hezekiah sick unto death. And Isaiah the prophet the son of Amoz came unto him, and said unto him, Thus saith the Lord, Set thine house in order: for thou shalt die, and not live.

2 Then Hezekiah turned his face toward the wall, and prayed unto the Lord,

3 And said, Remember now, O Lord, I beseech thee, how I have walked before thee in truth and with a perfect heart, and have done that which is good in thy sight. And Hezekiah wept sore.

Did you notice Hezekiah didn't say *he* had been perfect? He said he had served God by walking "in truth and with a perfect heart." His heart was right toward God. And that made all the difference.

GOD LOOKS AT THE HEART

Many years ago, while praying in a church before a meeting, I got to talking to the Lord about the past. I could see places where I had missed it. At the time, I thought I had done well. But when I looked back, I could see some glaring mistakes, and I felt bad about them.

The Lord puts our mistakes under Jesus' blood when we ask Him to. Not only that, He said He hides our sins in the depths of the sea (Micah 7:19). Yet sometimes, we go fishing for them.

While I was praying, the Lord reminded me of what He said the time Samuel went down to Jesse's house to anoint one of his sons king in Saul's place. Naturally they brought the oldest son, Eliab, out first. Seeing his countenance and stature, Samuel thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is before him" (1 Sam. 16:6). But God corrected him.

The Lord said to Samuel, "He's not the one." He said, "Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart" (1 Sam. 16:7).

Too often we look at situations and say, "That's impossible."

But nothing is truly impossible.

The Lord said to me that day, "I wasn't looking at you on the outside. You're looking at where you missed it from a human standpoint. But I was looking at your heart. I saw the intent of your heart. Even though you had done wrong and had missed it, I wrote down, 'This man's heart is perfect toward Me.'"

When the Lord said that to me, it was so real I began to weep. It did something on the inside of me.

Hezekiah wasn't perfect either, but his heart was right. He wanted to do the right thing, even if he didn't always get it right. That's what the Lord is looking for.

ISAIAH 38:4-5

4 Then came the word of the Lord to Isaiah, saying,
5 Go, and say to Hezekiah, Thus saith the Lord, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears: behold, I will add unto thy days fifteen years.

Notice, God didn't just say, "I heard your prayer." He also said, "I've seen your tears." All of us have cried and prayed at times, and it didn't bring us results, so we know there has to be more to it than that.

The Bible states that Hezekiah was "sick unto death." Not only was he incurably ill, but God Himself had pronounced a death sentence on him. Isaiah the prophet came and gave King Hezekiah a message from the Lord, saying, "Set thine house in order: for thou shalt die, and not live" (Isa. 38:1).

Amazingly, Hezekiah did not die. And he did not set his house in order. What did he do? The Bible tells us exactly what he did: "Then Hezekiah turned his face toward the wall, and prayed unto the Lord" (v. 2). What does that mean? It means he turned away from man.

Many people haven't gotten results because they're looking to man for help. But Hezekiah turned away from man and from everything else—his own sufferings, his symptoms, medical help, and even Isaiah, one of the greatest of prophets! And with his face to the wall, Hezekiah could see only one thing: God.

WHAT CAN YOU BELIEVE?

Hezekiah's story proves that faith makes the impossible possible. His circumstances were dire, yet God extended his life. With a right heart, he pleaded with God for mercy, and God granted his request. And God will do the same for us today. Instead of focusing on what seems impossible, we must fix our eyes on God, trust His promises, and believe that with Him, all things are possible.

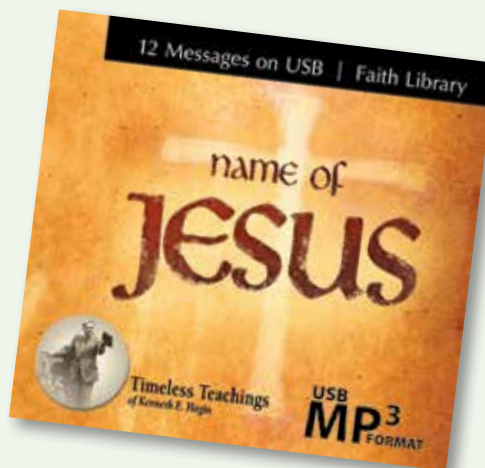
The question isn't, "What can God do?" We already know He can do anything. The question is—what can you believe? What God does for you depends on your answer.♥

Understanding God's Healing Power

FOR A MOMENT, I am going to liken the healing power of God to something that is very common today: electricity. When it comes to electricity, in order to have confidence in it and cooperate with it, we must understand the laws that govern it. The more knowledge we have of these laws, the more we can benefit from electricity and be blessed by it.

Before the laws of electricity were discovered, electricity was *present*, but it was not much of a blessing to anyone. Electricity has been around since the creation of the world. It was present in Abraham's time, Moses' time, and even Peter's time. But none of these men enjoyed its benefits. Yet I am sure that at times these men must have had situations where electricity would have made life easier for them.

Even though these men and other people of their time needed electricity, it didn't manifest itself just because they needed it. Electricity has been around since the creation of the world. But not until men like Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Edison, and many others began to learn about the laws that govern it did man begin to benefit from it. These men made it possible for us to benefit from and enjoy something that had always been present, yet lay inactive. Once

those laws were discovered and cooperated with, life as we know it has not been the same.

LIKE ELECTRICITY, THE HEALING POWER OPERATES BY CERTAIN LAWS

If all of the above is true concerning electricity, it is also true concerning God's healing power. This *power* to free us from the oppression of sickness and disease was supplied to us through the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. That event supplied the power to be saved from sin. But it also made available to mankind the power to be healed. The healing power has been present ever since that wonderful event occurred. And since that time, thousands have needed to benefit from that power.

However, like electricity, there are laws that govern the operation of the healing power of God. The discovery of these laws makes it possible for us to cooperate with the power and be blessed by it. The laws that govern the operation of this power are not hidden from us. But if these laws are to be discovered, we must go to the right location and begin to dig. The laws that govern this power can only be found in the Word of God. They are

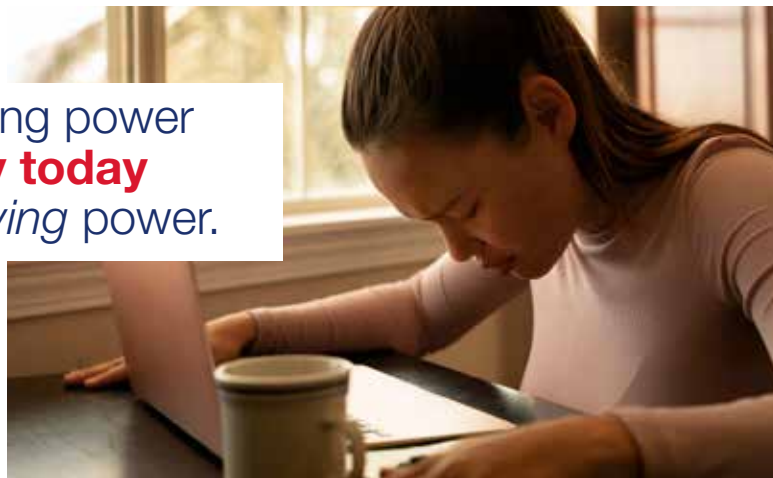
revealed to us through the ministry of Jesus, primarily through His words and actions. Listening to what Jesus said and watching what Jesus did will reveal many things that will help us come to know and understand the laws that govern the healing power of God.

Many today are concluding that the reason we do not see more people healed is a lack of power. So they have begun to pray for more power. But we must accept the fact that through His death, burial, and resurrection, Jesus supplied all the healing power we need! Praying for more healing power is as unnecessary today as praying for more *saving* power.

We do not have a power problem today. What we have is a knowledge problem. We are ignorant of the laws that govern the healing power of God. Therefore, we are incapable of obtaining it and cooperating with it in order to receive the healing we so desperately need. Once we understand the laws, we can connect or unite our faith with God's power. And we can keep our faith "connected" until any yoke of sickness in our lives is destroyed. ♥

WHEN YOU STUDY the Bible, you will find that God has much to say about the care of the family.

Personally, I believe that God's Word teaches us to take care of our families first—before all other obligations. First Timothy 5:8 (NLT)

says, *“But those who won't care for their relatives, especially those in their own household, have denied the true faith. Such people are worse than unbelievers.”*

Caring for a family, however, involves more than just providing food, shelter, and clothing. It also involves giving love, discipline, and time to family members. Remember, your children don't learn just from your words. They also learn from your actions and attitudes. But they can't pick up their parents' actions or attitudes if those parents are absent from the home.

I believe that a man's personal relationship with God, his spouse, their children, and his ministry calling or secular work are to be ranked in that order. Families should not suffer because of your call or job. Yes, there are times you have to be away from your family. But there are also times when your family must come first.

NOBODY CARED ABOUT CURTIS

Any parent can get so involved in their work that their children suffer. Before Lynette and I had children, I coached

track. Some parents never came to watch their kids race. Their children worked hard running track every afternoon, but some parents never attended a meet.

One little red-headed boy named Curtis trained especially hard. He couldn't run fast, but he was good at running long distances. At the city track meet, he won easily. But his parents weren't there to see their son run.

I watched Curtis through the years. By the time he was in junior high school, he wasn't involved in anything. Do you know why? Nobody cared.

WORK AT YOUR RELATIONSHIPS

When my children were young, I was traveling for ministry. It wasn't easy holding a three-day meeting, rushing to the plane, flying all night with little rest, and then changing into jeans when I got home so I could spend the day with my family. But I did it because my wife and children mattered to me.

To win your children, you must put forth effort to build a close relationship with them. It takes time to build relationships. It takes effort to get involved with your children's activities after spending a long day at work. It takes sacrifices on the parent's part to put the children's interests before their own.

IT'S YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

I believe the Word of God teaches that your spouse and children are your primary responsibility, even above your ministry or job. Children did not ask to be brought into the world. You and your spouse brought them into the world, and God says you are responsible to raise them in the paths of righteousness and godliness.

That responsibility does not belong to a babysitter, a grandmother, or an aunt. It doesn't matter how much other people may love your children—they cannot give them what you can give them.

God's Word teaches us to TAKE CARE OF OUR FAMILIES FIRST—before all other obligations.

It's time to realize that God does not expect us to shirk our responsibilities in one area so we can pick up another responsibility somewhere else.

Sometimes the call or job must come first and the family second. But that's not all the time. Let that circle rotate and bring the family up on top the next time. Learn how to let it be a natural rotation: call or job, spouse, children.

When you do that, you will find that you are living a happy, well-balanced family life. This won't happen, however, without work, tears, and dedication on your part. When my children were young, I shed a few tears over having to leave my family to go preach. I'm dedicated to God's call, but I'm just as dedicated to my family.

There were times when I had to travel and preach, but there were other times when I let the invitation to preach slide so I could spend time with my wife and the kids.

SEEING A SERMON

When Craig and Denise were young, they needed to see me choosing priorities and living life to its fullest. They needed to

see me doing that, not just hear about it. (They also saw God's love at the heart of my decisions.) Because I always made time for them and their needs, I never had to worry about them turning away from God when they got older.

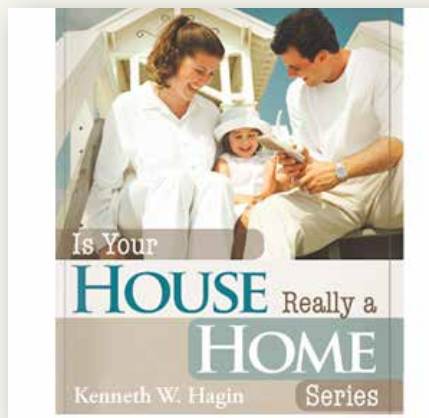
By learning to mesh your call or job and your family life, you will find that your life becomes well-rounded. Your call or job and your spouse and children will rotate naturally, all centered around God.

Your children will see you living the Christian life—not saying one thing and doing another. Although this kind of lifestyle takes dedication to achieve, you will find that life will become beautiful as you learn to keep the proper balance between your call or job and your family.♥

Think HIGHER Thoughts

EVERY ACTION IN our life starts with a thought. The way we think affects how we live. So God wants us to think like He does. He said in Isaiah 55:8–9 (NLT), “*My thoughts are nothing like your thoughts,*” says the Lord. *‘And my ways are far beyond anything you could imagine. For just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so my ways are higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts.’*”

Thinking God’s higher thoughts will help us better ourselves. But how can we do that? Our natural, lower thoughts often seem to lead us to doubt, fear, and failure. However, the good news is that, as believers, we are not limited to our natural way of thinking. First Corinthians 2:16 says, “*We have the mind of Christ.*” That means we have access to a higher way of thinking.

THINKING Like Jesus

Jesus never considered failure. If we could ask Him if He ever doubted He could walk on water, He would say, “Absolutely not.” If we asked Him if He wondered whether the water would turn to wine, He’d reply, “No, I never thought that.” Jesus lived on earth with complete confidence in God.

David and Daniel had the same mindset. When David faced Goliath, he didn’t wonder if he would win. He declared victory before the battle even began (1 Sam. 17:45–47). When Daniel was thrown into the lions’ den, he trusted God. And God shut the

lions’ mouths. The thoughts of these men lined up with God’s higher ways, and their actions followed.

What about us? When trials come, do we think like overcomers? Or do we let fear and doubt overcome us? Our thoughts determine our outcome.

The POWER of Thoughts

Everyone faces mental battles, no matter how long they’ve been a Christian. Even my grandfather, Kenneth E. Hagin, struggled with this sometimes. He used to share how his sister’s death troubled him. He had prayed and believed for her healing, yet she passed away. When Brother Hagin questioned it in prayer, God told him, “Do not touch that again in your thought life.” Why? Because dwelling on it would lead to doubt and discouragement.

The same applies to us. How many times have we replayed a thought we knew we should let go of? We rehearse our disappointments, regrets, and unanswered prayers until they weigh us down. All the while the Holy Spirit is telling us, “Don’t touch that.” He knows if we keep thinking about certain things, they will shape our actions—and not for the better.

When I faced unanswered prayers, I remembered my grandfather’s words and said, “I’m not going to touch that again in my thought life.” That decision freed me from unnecessary mental battles.

RENEW Your Mind

How do we change the way we think? Romans 12:2 (NKJV) gives us the answer: *“Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.”*

The world is never going to think like God thinks. And our natural reactions to things will not be godly. Our thoughts will naturally conform to fear, negativity, and doubt. That’s why renewing our minds isn’t optional—it’s essential.

I once heard a friend of mine use a great illustration: If you squeeze an orange, orange juice comes out. If you squeeze grapes, grape juice comes out. But when life squeezes a lot of Christians, God does not come out! You don’t get God juice! Instead of producing faith, peace, and confidence, the pressures of life produce frustration and fear.

What comes out of us depends on what we’re filled with. If we are full of doubt, then doubt will come out. On the other hand, if we are full of God’s Word, faith will come out.

COLOSSIANS 3:1–3 NKJV

- 1 If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God.
- 2 Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.
- 3 For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.

This means we must renew our minds to focus on what aligns with Christ. We must get to know Him through the Word of God. We’re told in the verses following these to “put off” things of the old man—anger, malice, filthy language, lying, and slander. Then we’re told to “put on” things like love, kindness, peace, humility, and longsuffering. When our minds and hearts line up with Christ, we stop worrying about things that don’t matter.

MAKING the Abnormal Normal

We must renew our minds with the Word of God to think like Jesus does. But renewing our minds is not a one-time event—it’s a daily process. It requires intentionally filtering our thoughts and refusing to dwell on things that pull us away from faith in God.

At first, it’s easy to reject a negative thought. But if we let it linger, it takes root. The more we tell ourselves, “I’m not going

to make it,” the harder it becomes to believe otherwise. We must take control of our thoughts early.

Thinking like Jesus is not the norm in today’s world. But we are called to live differently. What the world sees as abnormal—faith, peace, and joy in the face of adversity—should be our normal. When we fill our minds with God’s Word, we won’t just think higher thoughts—we’ll live them.

So, the next time our mind wants to replay an old doubt, fear, or failure, let’s remind ourselves, “Don’t touch that thought.” Instead, let’s choose to think like Jesus—let’s choose to think higher.♥

The Power of a Single Thought

In Luke chapter 15 we read about the prodigal son. I don’t believe he woke up one morning and, on a whim, decided to ask his father for his inheritance and leave home. I think it’s likely his decision resulted from a process that started with a thought. I believe the prodigal son became frustrated. And as he thought about his problems, his thoughts led him down a path of poor choices. One unchecked thought set off a chain reaction that ultimately landed him in a pigpen.

WHAT IS GOD waiting for in this hour? He is waiting for souls—for the precious fruit of the earth. James 5:7 (NKJV) says, *“Therefore be patient, brethren, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth,*

waiting patiently for it until it receives the early and latter rain.”

The fire that's burning in your heart will soon begin to spread. It will spread to your neighbors, your city, your state, and your country. It will spread to every country on the earth.

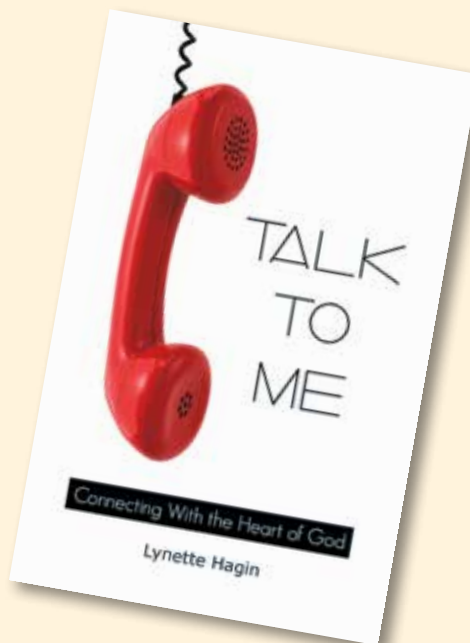

Our Identity

IN GOD’S EYES, bones hold deep significance. The Hebrew word for *bone, etsem*, means “self.” Even after flesh has decomposed, bones still retain a person’s “self,” their identity.

People may alter their appearance or take hormones to change who they are, but no one can change their bones. Our identity isn’t up for grabs. It’s sacred.

Forensic anthropologists reestablish identity from bones. When someone dies in a fiery crash or is murdered, their bones testify that they existed. A single bone reveals someone’s ancestry, age, height, and sex.

Our identity is so important that God put it in something that doesn’t decompose. Years after we’re gone, our bones testify that we lived.

Bones have a spiritual connotation because spiritual identity is absolutely essential.

Some people die never knowing their spiritual identity. They may have a big funeral, but if they didn’t walk in their God-ordained purpose, there’s no eternal evidence they ever lived. I don’t want to just live my life; I want to fulfill God’s purpose for me.

Following God isn’t about asking Him to bless our plans. It’s about living the life He predestined before we were born. We are not our parents’ idea; we are God’s idea. Our identity isn’t random; it has function, just like every part of our body has a purpose.

During Jesus’ first coming, people were positioned to fulfill their divine purpose. Now, before Jesus’ return, we must do the same.

We don’t know when He will return, but our generation lives in a time of increasing acceleration. That makes it crucial to step into who we were created to be.

Satan, the enemy of our souls, knows how powerful identity is. He hates it because within it is His undoing. He works relentlessly to deceive believers, redefining their identity so they live as if his lies are true. When we don’t walk in God’s purposes, we fail to live in the truth meant to set us free.

But the truth doesn’t change. If we don’t step into it, we lose the ability to live it out. Learning who we are is never a private victory. Our identity is meant to bless others. That’s why the enemy works to keep us from walking in our purpose.

Satan doesn’t just attack our minds; he works in our lives through things that happen to us. He wants bad things from our past to define our future.

He uses trauma, loss, abuse, or betrayal to define us. He uses childhood wounds, broken relationships, and pain to rewrite our identity, hoping the past will define our future. But we are not what happened to us—we are who God says we are.

The enemy is content with us getting just enough from church to survive but not enough to be part of an army that shifts the world. He wants us to remain bound

by past experiences instead of stepping into the freedom of our God-given identity.

But God is greater than our past. Our identity can be restored.

Second Corinthians 3:18 (AMP) says, *“And we all, with unveiled face, continually seeing as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are progressively being transformed into His image from [one degree of] glory to [even more] glory, which comes from the Lord, [who is] the Spirit.”*

We reclaim our identity by looking into the mirror of God’s glory. There, we see the identity God gave us. It doesn’t matter if we look like it, feel like it, or act like it. The truth of who we are in Christ remains.


In the Old Testament, God’s presence dwelled in the temple. In the New Testament, the Holy Spirit dwells in us. We have access to God’s presence anytime and anywhere.

None of us is so smart that we don’t need intimate time with God. In His presence we find ourselves and are restored. Whatever the enemy has done to us can be undone in God’s presence. There, we are redefined by the truth. ♥

GROWTH

Setting and reaching goals takes effort,
but when we do it God's way,
THE REWARDS ARE WORTH IT.

SOMEONE ONCE SAID, “If you aim at nothing, you’ll hit it every time.” That statement holds much truth. God doesn’t want us to drift through life without direction and never accomplish anything. I believe He calls us to set goals, work toward them, and grow in every area of our lives. In fact, the Bible is full of examples of goal setting and planning.

A BIBLICAL PRINCIPLE

Proverbs 29:18 says, “*Where there is no vision, the people perish.*” Vision is important to God, and having goals gives us direction. Proverbs 21:5 (NLT) also tells us, “*Good planning and hard work lead to prosperity, but hasty shortcuts lead to poverty.*” Notice it doesn’t just say planning—it includes hard work. Setting and reaching goals takes effort, but when we do it God’s way, the rewards are worth it.

Looking at creation, we see that God had a plan. He didn’t create the world in one day or in a random order. He had a structured plan for each day of creation. The same is true for salvation. God’s plan to send Jesus to save us didn’t happen overnight. It was in place from the very beginning. Throughout the Old Testament, we see prophecies and foreshadowing of Jesus’ coming. Even during the 400 years of silence before the New Testament, God’s plan never changed. When the time was right, Jesus came, fulfilled His mission, and made a way for us to have a relationship with God.

Isaiah 46:10 (NLT) says, “*Only I can tell you the future before it even happens.*” God is the ultimate goal setter. He sees the beginning and the end, and His plans always come to pass. Since we are made in His image, we should also be intentional about setting goals that align with His will.

SETTING GODLY GOALS

Proverbs 16:3 (NLT) says, “*Commit your actions to the Lord, and your plans will succeed.*” This means we shouldn’t set goals based solely on our own desires; instead, we should seek God first and surrender our plans to Him. Matthew 6:33 (NLT) reminds us, “*Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.*” We don’t want to leave God out of our plans. If we don’t seek Him first, nothing we do will succeed.

Too often, we let other people’s goals distract us. We hear what a friend is doing or see an influencer on social media, and suddenly we’re chasing after things God never told us to pursue. Instead of adopting other people’s goals, we should ask, “Lord, what do You want for me?” The Holy Spirit lives in us and knows the future. He will guide us toward the right goals if we listen to Him.

WRITING IT DOWN

After seeking God, the next step is writing our goals down. Habakkuk 2:2 (NKJV) says, “*Write the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it.*” Writing down our goals strengthens our commitment to them. Studies show that people who put their goals in writing are 42 percent more likely to achieve them than if they just say them out loud.

BREAKING GOALS INTO STEPS

Big goals can feel overwhelming. That’s why breaking them into smaller steps is so important. If our goal is too vague or broad, it’s easy to get stuck. For example, one year I set a goal to read 24 books. I wrote it down and was excited, but I didn’t

break it into steps. By the end of the year, I had read only nine books. I failed because I didn't have a clear plan.

I've found that a great way to set effective goals is to use the SMART method:

S—SPECIFIC: Clearly define the goal. What exactly do you want to achieve?

M—MEASURABLE: Make sure you can track progress. How will you know when you've reached your goal?

A—ACHIEVABLE: Is the goal realistic with God's help? Stretch yourself, but don't set an impossible standard.

R—RELEVANT: Does it align with God's plan for your life right now?

T—TIME-BOUND: Set a deadline to create urgency and focus.

Jesus Himself set a SMART goal. Luke 19:10 says the Son of Man came to seek and save those who were lost. His goal was specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound. And He accomplished it!

ACCOUNTABILITY MATTERS

Proverbs 27:17 (NLT) says, "As iron sharpens iron, so a friend sharpens a friend." We need people in our lives who will hold us accountable. A study by Dr. Gail Matthews of Dominican University of California found that people who wrote down their goals, broke them into steps, and provided weekly updates to a friend had a 76 percent success rate.* That's a huge jump from the 42 percent success rate of just writing goals down.

Find someone you trust—a friend, spouse, or mentor—and share your goals with them. Checking in regularly will help keep you accountable and on track.

CELEBRATE PROGRESS

As we work toward our goals, we should take time to celebrate milestones along the way. We can reflect on what we've accomplished, thank God for His help, and recognize our progress. This will keep us encouraged and motivated.

OVERCOMING OBSTACLES

Two things that often keep people from achieving their goals are fear of failure and procrastination.

Philippians 4:13 (NKJV) reminds us, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." We don't have to fear failure. Someone has said, "Don't fear failure. Fear being in the exact same place next year as you are today."

Someone once said, "Success is not final. Failure is not fatal. It is the courage to continue that counts." If you mess up one day, don't quit—just start again.

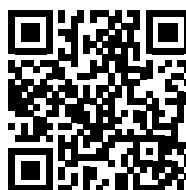
Procrastination is another roadblock. Proverbs 13:4 (NLT) says, "Lazy people want much but get little, but those who work hard will prosper." Success doesn't happen by accident. We have to take action.

A TIME OF GROWTH

As you set and pursue your goals, believe that God is working in you. He wants you to grow and accomplish great things. Ephesians 3:20 (TPT) says, "Never doubt God's mighty power to work in you and accomplish all this. He will achieve infinitely more than your greatest request, your most unbelievable dream, and exceed your wildest imagination! He will outdo them all, for his miraculous power constantly energizes you."

So seek God, make a plan, and take action. This can be your time to grow, flourish, and accomplish things you never thought possible!♥

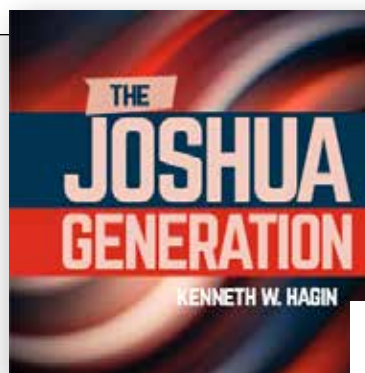

NEVER LET GO OF HOPE

THERE ARE TIMES in our lives when the circumstances or situations we are encountering seem too much to bear. Perhaps it is a diagnosis you didn't expect or a relationship you tried so hard to salvage crumbled anyway. Maybe your life hasn't gone the way you dreamed it would. In these moments, we can be tempted to not only let go of our faith but our hope as well.

If these have become your thoughts, know that Satan would love to destroy your faith and hope. Hebrews 11:1 says, "Now faith is the substances of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." I've heard people say, "I have given up all hope of this coming to pass."

It's important not to give up our hope. Hope comes before faith, and faith brings our hope into reality. Hope is not wishful thinking—it is a confident trust in God. It is a strong, anchored trust in God's faithfulness. Hebrews 6:19 (NIV) reminds us: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure."

Hope doesn't deny reality; it faces reality with the steady belief that our faith in God is still working, even when we cannot see it. Imagine a ship anchored in a storm. The waves are raging, but the ship is kept from drifting into destruction because of the anchor below the surface. In the same way, God's promises are our unseen anchor. We can anchor our hope in our faith in God. When you feel like letting go, cling tighter to the unchanging nature of God's goodness and promises, even when everything around you is changing.

One of the lies the enemy would love to tell you during hardship is that God has left you and is not going to rescue you this time. But scripture tells us otherwise. Deuteronomy 31:8 declares, (NLT) "Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord will personally go ahead of you. He will be with you; he will neither fail you nor abandon you."

When the Apostle Paul encountered hard and unexpected times, he wrote in Second Corinthians 4:8–9, (NLT) "We are pressed on every side by troubles, but we are not crushed. We are perplexed, but not driven to despair. We are hunted down, but never abandoned by God. We get knocked down, but we are not destroyed." Know that God is ever present and is at your disposal to see you through every circumstance you encounter.

Holding on to hope means holding on to God's promises, not just your expectations. Sometimes we struggle because we have confused our expectations with God's promises. We expect life to be easy. We expect our prayers to be answered in a certain way. We expect God's timing to match ours. But we must trust that God will work everything out according to His plan.

When difficult situations arise in my life that I don't understand, I am reminded of Romans 8:28, (NLT) "And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them." During those times, I quote this scripture and say to God, "The things I am encountering do not seem good at the moment, but I trust you to work them for my good."

If you are encountering hardship, I encourage you to commit it to God and don't lose hope. No matter how difficult it may seem at the moment, God will turn it around and cause it to work together for your good.

Know that your story is not over because your circumstances are hard. God's promises are stronger than your pain. When you can't see the way forward, focus on what you know—not on what you feel. Know that God is there for you.

If you are in the middle of a storm today, I want to remind you: Hope is not a flimsy feeling. It is a powerful, unbreakable anchor when it is anchored in God's promises. You are not defeated. You are not alone. Hold on to hope and place your faith in God. The God who holds the stars in place is also holding you, and He will never let you go.

I encourage you to reflect on Hebrews 10:23 (NLT) "Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep His promise." No matter what today looks like, God's promises are true. Your hope is not in what you see; it is in the One who sees you.♥
