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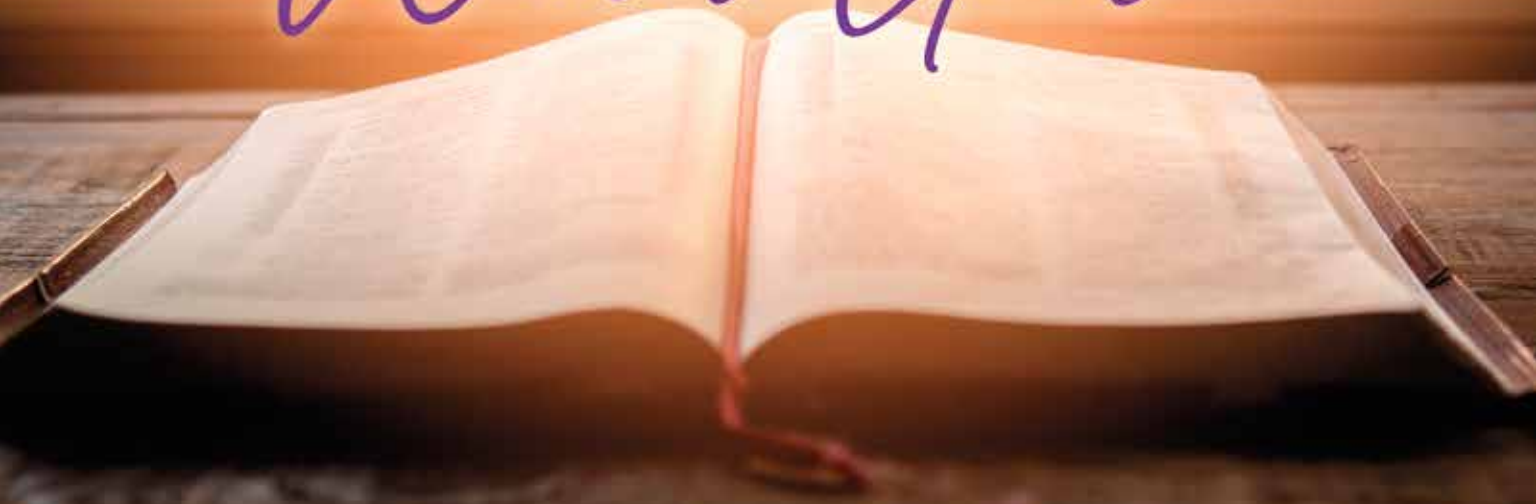

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You Can *Trust* the Father's Lead

RESEARCH SHOWS THAT children will imitate the actions of the adults in their home. This influences not only their conduct but also the way they understand and relate to the world.

My dad wasn't a perfect dad, but he was a really good one. When I was growing up, I loved holding his hand wherever we went because it made me feel so safe. He taught me about sports and prepared me to be a boy mom to my two sons later. Though he taught me a lot with his words, I also learned so much from his actions.

I truly believe that the best dads teach not only with their words, but also with their actions. You see, it is very easy to *say* the right thing, but it takes a lot of determination and morals to actually *do* the right thing. I believe

the greatest fathers live out what they say.

Anyone who knows my dad knows that one of his favorite sayings is "the natural and the supernatural coming together makes the explosive force for God." He taught me both naturally and supernaturally by walking out the scriptures (see James 1:22). And the most important life lesson he taught me was this: to follow my Heavenly Father wherever He leads me (see Rom. 8:14).

I remember being six, seven, and eight years old, traveling constantly with our family by airplane. Many times, we had really tight connections at airports like Dallas-Fort Worth or Chicago O'Hare International. We would literally have to run to make our connection.

As we were running, my dad would look at me and say, "Denise, listen to me. You stay

right behind me. You follow me through this crowd, and as long as you're right behind me and you can *see* me, you're going to be okay. We're going to get there, and we're going to make it." I'd say, "Okay, Daddy."

I would be running as fast as I could, and he would keep looking back at me. If I got too far behind him, he'd say, "Denise, come on. Catch up. You have to stay right behind me. That's where you're safe!" So, I learned how to follow him.

As a family, we used to ride three- and four-wheelers. We went to this place in Oklahoma called Little Sahara State Park. It has huge, mountainous desert sand dunes that go straight up. I always rode right behind my dad because he wanted to make sure I was safe. He would always say, "Hey, stay right behind me. Whatever I do, wherever I go, you do the same thing. When we make a sharp turn, if I lean one way, you lean that way too. You follow me."

I remember following my dad one time when he started going straight up this sand dune. I stopped. He turned around and looked at me. I shook my head and said, "No. I'm not doing that. It's too scary."

He came down to where I was and said, "Come on, baby. You can do it."

I replied, "Dad, I can't. It's too steep. I'm going to fall over."

He said, "No, you're not." To lessen my fear, he rode up to the top again and came back down.

I still said, "Nope, not doing it."

"Come on," he urged. "I promise you nothing's going to happen as long as you stay right behind me. I promise you'll get to the top. Trust me."

So, I said, "Okay, Dad. I will." Even though I was so scared, I rode as fast as I could. I got to the top, and we celebrated.

Dad taught me how to follow him even when it looked way too scary. If I got a little behind, he'd stop and wait for me,

cheering me on all the time. And the reason it is so significant is that it taught me this: If I could trust my earthly father and believe that he wouldn't let anything happen to me, and that he could see ahead when things got tough, I could trust my Heavenly Father the same way (see Psalm 56:3).

Dad taught me that when things get difficult, I can trust my Heavenly Father because He has my best interests in mind. He's not going to let anything happen to me because my Heavenly Father cares way more about me than my earthly father does.

When we follow our Heavenly Father, we know we'll be successful in life. John 10:27 says, "*My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me*" (NLT). In life, we have to follow Him even when it's scary, and even when we can't see the future.

When I was 23, an event shattered my entire world. There were days when I woke up and wished I weren't even alive. I was absolutely broken and didn't know how I was going to get past it.

My dad sat down with me and said, "I want to bring you to Jeremiah 29:11." It says, "*'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future'*" (NIV).

Dad reminded me that when I used to follow him at Little Sahara, even when it got scary and I didn't want to, I followed anyway. He said, "If you'll just trust your Heavenly Father as you trusted me, I promise you, He'll take you to the other side." And He did.

So, fathers, I want to ask you, what are your actions teaching your children? Only you can answer that. If you haven't been doing your best, you can change at any time. It just takes one decision. If you have been doing a great job in that area, I encourage you to keep modeling for your children what their Heavenly Father truly looks like.♥

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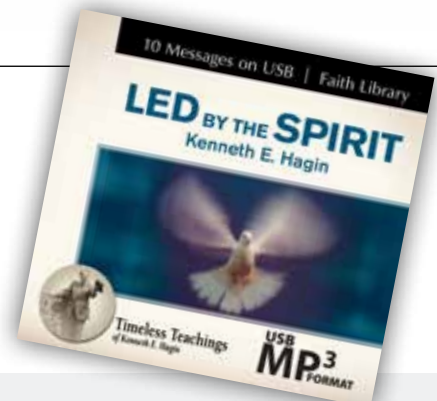
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THE WORD: God's Victory Lens for You

EVERY BELIEVER HAS an assignment from God (see 1 Cor. 12). There is something that God has called you to do. Maybe it's not to stand behind a pulpit. That doesn't make your assignment any less. You may be called to be a teacher, a bus driver, an attorney, a nurse, a doctor, or a stay-at-home mom. Whatever it is, there's a specific assignment for you.

The enemy will bring opposition to try to stop you from fulfilling that assignment (see 1 Cor. 16:9). He wants you to get so consumed with the *opposition* that you forget your *position*.

There are two lenses through which we can view our circumstances: the lens of our own human natural strength, or the lens of God's Word. Choose to focus on the Word.

No matter what comes against us, we have the Word of God that tells us we're overcomers. The Bible says that in this world we'll have tribulations, but it didn't stop there. Jesus said, *"But be of good cheer; I have overcome the world"* (John 16:33 NKJV).

Things are going to come against us. We know and understand that. But God has given us the necessary tools, equipment, and resources we need to stand against the enemy's attacks and walk in victory. To illustrate this, I want us to look at a very familiar person in the Word of God—Abraham.

ROMANS 4:17-18 (MSG)

17 We call Abraham "father" not because he got God's attention by living like a saint, but because God made something out of Abraham when he was a nobody. Isn't

that what we've always read in Scripture, God saying to Abraham, "I set you up as the father of many peoples"? Abraham was the first named "father" and then became a father because he dared to trust God to do what only God could do: raise the dead to life, with a word make something out of nothing.

18 When everything was hopeless, Abraham believed anyway, deciding to live not on the basis of what he saw he couldn't do but on what God said he would do." And so he was made the father of a multitude of peoples. God himself said to him, "You're going to have a big family, Abraham!"

Sometimes we're too quick to respond. How do I know? Because I've done it many, many times—in the wrong way. The stories in the Bible aren't included just to make a great Sunday school story. These things are in there for our example. And if we do what they did, we'll get the same results they did.

When Abraham received God's promise that he would be the father of many nations, he could easily have made a list of every single reason why that wasn't possible.

In verse 18, we notice that Abraham chose which direction to look. *"When everything was hopeless, Abraham believed anyway, deciding to live not on the basis of what he saw he couldn't do, but on the basis of what God said he would do."*

Every day, we have a choice about what we focus on. Abraham focused on *"what God said."* He

lifted his attention from the natural onto God's Word.

The next time your problems start screaming for your attention, ask yourself, "Is what I'm seeing greater than what He [God] says?" Absolutely not! I want to encourage you to look through the lens of God's Word today, fix your focus on the answer, and defeat the opposition. ♥

HOW TO STRENGTHEN YOUR RELATIONSHIP

With God



GOD NOT ONLY spoke to Abraham but also considered him a friend. Genesis 18:19 says, *“For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the Lord, to do justice and judgment; that the Lord may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.”*

The phrase *“I know him”* in this verse means God knew Abraham as an acquaintance, a familiar friend, and a kinsman. God referred to Abraham as a familiar friend. What kind of relationship do you have with God? Do you consider God a friend? Does God consider you a friend? These are important questions to ponder.

Abraham is an example for us to follow. If we believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and are living according to God’s Word, it is possible for us to have the kind of relationship with God that Abraham had.

1. We can talk to God heart to heart as Abraham did.

In Genesis 18:20, God and Abraham began sharing their hearts with one another. God told Abraham that He was going to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham bargained with God

to try to save those wicked cities for the sake of his nephew Lot and his family.

GENESIS 18:23–33 (NIV)

23 Abraham approached him [God] and said, “Will you sweep away both the righteous and the wicked?”

24 Suppose you find fifty righteous people living there in the city—will you still sweep it away and not spare it for their sakes?

25 Far be it from you to do such a thing—to kill the righteous with the wicked, treating the righteous and the wicked alike. Far be it from you! Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?”

26 The Lord said, “If I find fifty righteous people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake.”

27 Then Abraham spoke up again. “Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord, though I am nothing but dust and ashes,

28 What if the number of the righteous is five less than fifty? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five people?” “If I find forty-five there,” he said, “I will not destroy it.”

29 Once again he spoke to him, “What if only forty are found there?” He said, “For the sake of forty, I will not do it.”

30 Then he said, "May the Lord not be angry, but let me speak. What if only thirty can be found there?" He answered, "I will not do it if I find thirty there."

31 Abraham said, "Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord, what if only twenty can be found there?" He said, "For the sake of twenty, I will not destroy it."

32 Then he said, "May the Lord not be angry, but let me speak just once more. What if only ten can be found there?" He answered, "For the sake of ten, I will not destroy it."

33 When the Lord had finished speaking with Abraham, he left, and Abraham returned home.

In this passage, we see Abraham bargaining with God. When the Lord said He was going to destroy the city, Abraham said, "Wait a minute. There might be some righteous people living there. If there are 50 righteous people, will you spare the city?"

The Lord said, "Okay. If there are 50 righteous people there, I will spare it." Abraham got a little bolder and kept lowering the number until the Lord agreed to spare the city if just 10 righteous people could be found there. Evidently, they couldn't find 10 because the city was destroyed, but Lot and his two daughters were spared.

In every relationship, each person being able to share their heart with the other person is a vital key. There is no genuine relationship unless you can communicate heart-to-heart.

2. Like Abraham, we can share our concerns with God.

Notice that Abraham and God talked with one another. God shared His plan, and Abraham shared his concern. As God shares His plans with you, are you able to share your concerns with Him? If you have a proper relationship with Him, you can.

In Genesis 18, God was willing to adjust His plans because Abraham was concerned about his relatives in Sodom. When God shares His plans with you, because you are in a covenant relationship with Him, as Abraham was, He will work with you concerning your desires in the situation. You are a spiritual descendant of Abraham, our father in the faith. If God worked with Abraham and altered His plan for him, why wouldn't He work with you?

3. Abraham took advantage of the covenant he had with God, and so can we.

If you are born again and have a covenant relationship with God, you, too, are God's friend.

Are you taking advantage of the covenant you have with God? Are you communicating with Him regularly? Are you spending time worshipping God? Are you discussing things with Him before you do them? Are you willing to follow and obey Him implicitly?

Determine in your heart today that you are going to walk according to God's Word and live in a covenant relationship with Him the way Abraham did. Then you will receive the blessing of Abraham and be called God's friend.♥

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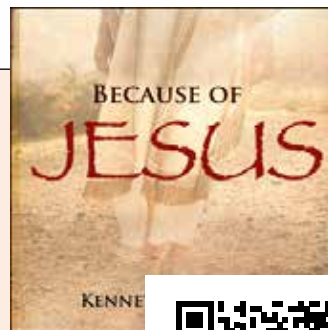
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G.L.O.W.—Go Light Our World

CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED to be a light to the world. Jesus tells us in Matthew 5:16 (NIV), “*Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.*” Our words and actions are to shine and point others directly back to God.

As believers, glowing should come naturally, right? But what does it truly take to stand out in a dark world? Here are four essential points I believe the Holy Spirit revealed to me.

First, glowing takes *godly boldness*. There are a lot of loud people out there, but loud doesn’t equal bold. Think about it: Jesus was bold. He never did anything just to create noise or have an argument. Godly boldness isn’t yelling at people, demanding that they change their ways, and telling them all the sins they’re living in. That kind of behavior won’t change anybody’s mind. It’s not getting on Facebook and anonymously putting your opinion on someone’s controversial post. We’re not winning anybody by doing that. Boldness isn’t always something we say. Actions speak a lot louder than words. Boldness might be walking away from a situation, not arguing even when we’re being baited. **SOMETIMES BOLDNESS IS SIMPLY STANDING UP FOR JESUS IN A WORLD THAT HATES HIM.** At the end of the day, we should be bold because we want to bring more people to Heaven with us. That’s our only job down here.

Second, we must be *loyal to Jesus*. Bees serve as a perfect example of loyalty in the animal kingdom. A swarm of bees is incredibly faithful to its queen—if she leaves, the entire swarm stops what it’s doing to follow her. We should ask ourselves: “Am I willing

to do whatever it takes to follow Jesus?” Here’s the thing: If we don’t know Him, we can’t be loyal to Him. We need to spend time in the Word, pray, and attend church to grow in our relationship with Him and develop our loyalty. Let’s prioritize these things and surrender our lives to Jesus. If we choose to keep our lives for ourselves, we’ll forfeit what we’re trying to keep (see Luke 17:33). Instead, we must know Jesus and be fiercely loyal to Him. As we surrender to Him, He will show us what it is like to truly live.

The third thing required for us to glow is *outrageous love*. John 13:35 (NLT) says, “*Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.*” Jesus modeled this for us. Over and over, we see Him connecting with people everyone else avoided. Jesus loved people, even if the Pharisees were appalled at Him for doing so. The world cannot understand His kind of outrageous love because it’s different. It’s not what the world is used to. The next time someone hurts you, choose to love them. That kind of love moves even the hardest hearts.

And lastly, glowing requires *walking in the Spirit*. We don’t have to do this life alone. **WE GET HELP TO BE BOLD, LOYAL, AND LOVING BECAUSE THE HOLY SPIRIT LIVES INSIDE US.** Jesus could only be in one place at a time. So after His resurrection, He sent the Holy Spirit to us. That way, He can be with us all the time,

everywhere we go. Jesus gave us the Holy Spirit so that we can go into the world and truly shine for the Lord. Isn’t it amazing that the same resurrecting power that raised Jesus from the dead lives in us (Rom. 8:11)? On our own, we are nothing special. But once we give our lives to Jesus, we start glowing. And when we continue to seek God and let the Holy Spirit lead us, we will shine more and more brightly.

We can be an unstoppable force for God and bring many lost people into the Kingdom. Let’s carry a godly boldness wherever we go, demonstrate unmatched loyalty, and love outrageously while following the Holy Spirit. We have to walk in His power if we’re going to do what we’re called to in these last days. We are to glow, be the light of the world, and bring many people to Heaven with us.♥

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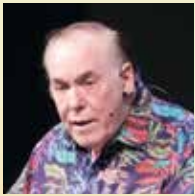
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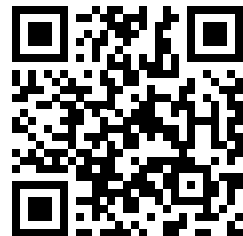

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SIGNS OF THE TIMES

The hope of Jesus' coming is a **purifying hope**.



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also signs of the times found in God's Word.

In Luke 21:25–27, Jesus said that before the Son of Man returned, there would be *signs* in the sun, moon, and stars. In fact, throughout most of the chapter, Jesus talked about the signs that would point to His return. Therefore, we need to discern the signs of the times!

People are always prophesying that Jesus will come at a certain time. But Jesus Himself said He doesn't know the day or hour of His return; only the Heavenly Father knows (Mark 13:32). However, one thing we do know for certain: Jesus *is* coming again! And according to the Word of God, there are signs to let us know when the time of His return is near.

DO NOT BE TROUBLED

Let's look at Second Timothy.

2 TIMOTHY 3:1

1 This know also, that in the last days PERILOUS TIMES shall come.

JUST AS THERE are natural signs in the physical world, such as dark clouds before a storm, there are

The expression "last days" is used several times in the New Testament by different writers. Here, the Apostle Paul writes that in the last days, *perilous times* shall come, and he goes on to list many more signs in Second Timothy 3:3-4. We are living in perilous times right now, and it's just one sign that the coming of Jesus is near. But we are not afraid because God has not given us a spirit of fear!

Notice in Second Peter that false teachers are another sign of the last days (2 Pet. 2:1–3). A true teacher and minister of the Gospel does not put money first. Sure, he will teach God's people the Word about giving tithes and offerings because he wants them to be blessed. But there is a vast difference between teaching people the Word about giving and "making merchandise" of them.

In Matthew chapter 24, Jesus provided us with some other signs relating to the end times.

MATTHEW 24:6–8

6 And ye shall hear of WARS AND RUMOURS OF WARS: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet.

7 For NATION SHALL RISE AGAINST NATION, and

KINGDOM AGAINST KINGDOM: and there shall be FAMINES, and PESTILENCES, and EARTHQUAKES, in divers places.

8 All these are the beginning of sorrows.

Jesus said there would be an increase of wars and what we call natural disasters. But He also said not to be troubled when these things come to pass because the end is not yet. All these are just the *beginning* of sorrows. However, if you look at these signs, you can readily see that His coming is near.

LOOK FOR THE LORD'S RETURN

We can see in many of the epistles Paul wrote that the Early Church was looking for Jesus to return at any time. But there were scoffers who said, "It hasn't happened yet. Jesus hasn't returned." Peter addressed this, saying, "I am stirring up your pure minds by way of remembrance that one day with the Lord is as a thousand years, and a thousand years is as one day. Therefore, rest assured! He is coming." In the last days, scoffers will come walking after their own lusts; they are just another sign of the times (see 2 Pet. 3:1–8).

If you don't believe Jesus is coming again, then it doesn't make any difference to you how you live. But when you *know* He is coming, the hope of His return will affect the way you live. The Bible says every man who has this hope in Him purifies himself (1 John 3:3). The hope of Jesus' coming causes us to purify our lives.

Someone might ask, "Well, why hasn't Jesus come?" Because He is waiting for the precious fruit of the earth, and He has long patience for it!

JAMES 5:7

7 Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, until he receive the early and latter rain.

We, too, should be patient and establish our hearts, for the coming of the Lord draws nigh! Several years ago, I was particularly impressed with this verse of Scripture, and I thought: There is going to be an end-time revival, and people from every nation will be saved! Jesus Himself said in Matthew 24:14, "*This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in ALL the world for a witness unto all nations; and THEN shall the end come.*" So there has to be a revival before He comes again. That means a worldwide harvest of souls—of people being saved and born again into the family of God!

PURSUE THE HARVEST

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit is another sign of the last days. God will pour out His Spirit on all flesh (Acts 2:14–18). That means *all* people, including church folk. Therefore, not only will unsaved folks be born again and become children of God, but people will be baptized and filled with the Spirit! You see, God is interested in getting the lost saved, but He is also interested in reviving dead church members—getting them filled with the Spirit and "on fire" for Him. When believers get on fire, they also get to work. They find their place in the Body and help reap the end-time harvest. Revival is not just a matter of folks

getting blessed. It is a matter of folks getting blessed and being a blessing. We want to get blessed so we can *be* a blessing!

Friends, the signs of the times all point to the fact that we are living in the last days. Jesus is coming again. But right now, He is waiting for the precious fruit of the earth. God is pouring out His Spirit in these last days, calling the world to salvation through repentance and calling Christians to get on fire for Him. Scoffers will continue walking after their own lusts until the very end. But make sure that *you* correctly discern the signs of the times!

If you are truly looking for Jesus to come, it will affect the way you live—because the hope of His return is a *purifying* hope. So examine yourself and lay down anything of the flesh that hinders you from going forth in the work of the Lord. Be filled with the Holy Spirit and stay full so you can be the blessing God ordained you to be in these last days!♥

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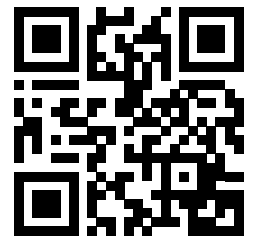
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Dangerous Self-Honor

FOR YEARS, I taught that the opposite of honor is dishonor, but that's not true. Dishonor is simply the offspring of something more cancerous to our lifestyle and livelihood than we can ever imagine. The mother of dishonor is self-honor. When self-honor is alive, we will dishonor God, the Word, and the Holy Spirit. We'll dishonor our mother and our father. We'll dishonor our spouse. It's impossible to honor others in life when our primary goal is to honor ourselves. When self sits on the throne, everyone else becomes insignificant.

The first display of self-honor appears in Isaiah 14:12–15, with Lucifer's fall. He was the third-highest angelic force in Heaven, alongside Gabriel and Michael. Each one of them had a third of the angels assigned to them. And yet we see a deterioration in Lucifer's service and attitude toward God. With his angels, he actually set out to rebel against God through war. Because of the desire to self-honor, he became dishonorable to God and therefore unusable by Him. Lucifer endeavored to honor himself and failed to obtain honor altogether.

Jesus exemplifies that to be honored, we have to strip ourselves of any desire to self-promote. We must let go of our own words, thoughts, and ideas, and instead embrace God's ideas. Jesus, our Savior, stripped Himself of all His heavenly dignity and all of His heavenly power, and became as a man.

In Philippians 2:8–9, Paul writes that when Jesus was “*found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name.*” Jesus

obtained honor by stripping Himself of His own personal desires. He submitted Himself completely to His Father and remained continually available to the Spirit of God. He emptied Himself and became a vessel.

So here we have an individual, Jesus, who was going to live for God, whether He was honored or not. Then we have another individual, Lucifer, whose only goal was to be honored, recognized, and seen. One obtained honor, while the other came dreadfully short of it. This gives us some insight into the dangers of promoting our opinions and ways over God's Word and His ways.

I've come to notice that in Galatians 5:19–21, the works of the flesh are simply a manifestation of self-honor. These behaviors are produced when we honor our flesh: our ways, desires, and pursuits.

No clearer do we see the pull of dishonor than in the workplace. We must not honor self on the job. When we do, we're actually pushing people toward hell more than we can imagine. In 1 Timothy 6:1 and Titus 2:9–10, Paul writes that our conduct on the job can either push people away from desiring a relationship with God or make a relationship with Him look attractive. When we're not functioning properly within God's design, we're dishonoring the Designer. We are to exert as much effort when we're not being watched as when we are. A God-honoring person works steadfastly no matter what.

The opposite of fleshly, self-

focused behaviors are the works of the Spirit. Every one of the godly fruits listed in Galatians 5:22 brings honor to God. Why? Because when we walk in love, we're honoring God. When we're long-suffering toward an individual, we're honoring God. When we are gentle toward an individual who doesn't deserve it, we're honoring God.

The point of the matter is simply this. Ecclesiastes 12:13 says, “*Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man.*” Find out what the Word says about how you are to function in the positions you're in. Then say, “Father, not my will, but Thine be done.”

Strip yourself of your personal ambitions, desires, and opinions, thinking, “Well, I deserve this.” Let it be done with the Word of God. Let's honor Him with the Word throughout our lives.♥

DON'T WORRY—GOD IS ALREADY THERE

WE ARE LIVING in a time when anxiety and worry seem to be constant companions for many. The pressures of life, the uncertainty of the future, financial concerns, health challenges, and family situations—these things can easily weigh heavily on the heart. If we are not careful, worry will quietly take up residence in our thoughts and begin to shape our outlook on life.

Yet in the midst of all this, Jesus gives us a clear and direct command: "Do not worry." That's not a suggestion. It's not a gentle recommendation. It's a command!

In Matthew 6:25, Jesus speaks directly to worry. He says, *"Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?"* He then reminds us to look at the birds of the air—they don't sow or reap, yet our Heavenly Father feeds them. He also points to the lilies of the field, which grow without toil yet are clothed in beauty greater than Solomon's.

What is Jesus doing? He is shifting our focus. Worry always magnifies the problem. Faith magnifies God. When we worry, we are consumed with "What if?" What if this doesn't work out? What if things get worse? But faith says, "Even if... God is still faithful."

Even if the situation doesn't look like I expected it to... God is still working. Even if I don't understand the timing... God is still in control. Even if I feel overwhelmed... God has not left me. There is a simple yet powerful truth we must anchor ourselves in: God has your best interests in mind. He is not distant. He is not unaware. He is not indifferent to what you are facing. In fact, He is already present in your tomorrow.

One subtle danger of worry is that it tries to convince us that everything depends on us. It places the burden of outcomes squarely on our shoulders. But Jesus reminds us that our Heavenly Father knows what we need—before we even ask (Matthew 6:8). Worry says,

"I have to figure this out."

Faith says, "God is already working it out." Worry drains your

strength. Faith renews your strength. Worry clouds your thinking. Faith brings clarity and peace.

I'm reminded of something lighthearted yet surprisingly meaningful—the little fish from the song "Don't Worry, Be Happy."TM While it may seem simple, there's a truth hidden there. Sometimes we overcomplicate what God has already made clear. We carry burdens we were never meant to carry. That doesn't mean we ignore responsibility or pretend problems don't exist. It means we refuse to let worry dominate our hearts. It means we choose trust over torment.

Philippians 4:6–7 says: *"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."* Notice the process: Be anxious for nothing. Pray about everything. Thank God in advance. Receive supernatural peace.

One of the most practical ways to combat worry is to replace it with prayer. Every time a worry arises, turn it into a prayer. Don't rehearse the problem—release it. Instead of saying, "What am I going to do?" say, "Lord, I trust You with this." Instead of saying, "This is too much for me," say, "This is not too much for God." Instead of carrying it all day, lay it down—again and again if needed.

Sometimes we think victory over worry means we will never feel pressure again. That's not realistic. The victory is in how we respond when pressure comes. Do we hold on to it, or do we hand it over? God is not asking you to pretend everything is perfect. He is asking you to trust Him in the midst of what is not.

Isaiah 26:3 (NLT) says: *"You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you!"*

Today, if anxiety has been knocking at your door, you don't have to invite it in. You can make a different choice. You can choose peace. You can choose trust. You can choose to believe that God is already ahead of you, making a way where there seems to be no way.

So, take a deep breath. Release what you've been holding. Remind yourself: God is with me. God is for me. God is working on my behalf. Don't worry. Trust Him—and yes, be happy in Him. ♥

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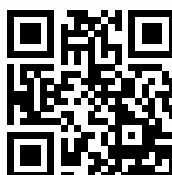
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
